a. Combined Task Force seizes hundreds of kilos of illegal drugs in the Indian Ocean

Combined Task Force (CTF) 150 has seized more than \$189 million worth of illegal drugs (at regional wholesale prices) during counter-narcotics operations at sea in 2021. The drugs seized this year have a higher total value than the amount of drugs the task force interdicted in the previous four years combined.

b. IMO Assembly Adopts Amendments to Expand Council to 52 Member States

The International Maritime Organization's highest governing body, the IMO Assembly, has adopted new amendments to expand the size of IMO Council, which is the executive organ responsible for supervising the work of the IMO. In addition to expanding the size of the Council from 40 to 52, the adopted amendments to the IMO Convention will extend the term of its Members and recognize three additional language texts as authentic versions of the IMO Convention.

c. First Look at Maersk's New Green Methanol-Powered Containerships

Shipping giant Maersk has unveiled its design for a series of eight 'carbon-neutral' methanol-powered ultra-large containerships currently on order. The 16,000 TEU capacity ships will be built by Hyundai Heavy Industries (HHI) with delivery planned in the first quarter of 2024. The vessels, measuring 350 meters long and 53.5 meters wide, will come with a dual fuel engine setup that will enable operation on carbon-neutral green methanol as well as conventional low Sulphur fuel.

d. Shipping Alliances Drop Hundreds of Asia-North Europe Port Calls Due to Congestion

Nearly a quarter of the scheduled port calls of Asia-North Europe alliance loops were omitted in the past five months, according to an Alphaliner survey. The consultant found the three alliances had cancelled 383 calls during the period, attributed to port congestion, throwing the supply chains of thousands of shippers into disarray.

e. Vaccination offered to all seafarers on Panama-flagged vessels

Panama President Laurentino Cortizo has announced all seafarers aboard Panama-flagged vessels will be able to be vaccinated when they dock in Panama regardless of their nationality. The seafarers willing to receive the vaccine AstraZeneca, will need only to coordinate through the company's local agent local in Panama who will inform the Panama Maritime Authority and the Ministry of Health.

Decarbonization is an issue that is currently affecting shipping, and it will shape the course of the industry for generations to come. The industry has to decide how they will address these future regulations, whether they implement new technologies, switch to new fuel sources, and/ or change operational methods. Many have serious concerns regarding this, but some key stakeholders see this as an opportunity to transform our maritime industry along the lines of environmental sustainability, paving the way for a future of zero emission vessels for international shipping.
