1. A Royal Navy officer whose ship has delivered blows to both drug smugglers and terrorists in 2022 has been decorated in the King's first Operational Honours for the forces.

Commander Claire Thompson Royal Navy will receive the OBE on her return to the UK, recognition for her deeds and accomplishments captaining HMS Montrose in the Gulf. The frigate has proved to be one of the Royal Navy's most successful and effective warships this year, with Commander Thompson and her 200-strong team of sailors and Royal Marines scoring four major drugs busts, plus two illegal arms caches.

2. Somali pirates have all but disappeared but other threats remain at sea.

Cases of piracy in the Indian Ocean have fallen significantly but maritime security experts say other illicit activities remain a concern. "Piracy areas have been shrinking," said Olli Pekka Suorsa, assistant professor in homeland security at the UAE's Rabdan Academy. "The industry is planning to altogether remove the high-risk area in the Indian Ocean in January 2023." This will come into effect after several reductions in the size of the high-risk areas in the region, which are currently around the Horn of Africa," he said at an event hosted by Trends Research and Advisory. "This decision comes from the shipping industry itself, a regional stakeholder, and reflects the dramatic decline in actual piracy incidents," Mr Suorsa said. However, he and other security experts urged naval efforts to continue as practices such as weapon smuggling and environmental crimes such as illegal fishing remain.

3. Massive drug bust for US Navy in the Gulf of Aden.

The US Navy's guided-missile destroyer USS Nitze has seized an estimated \$20 million worth of illegal drugs from a fishing vessel while patrolling the Gulf of Aden. The USS Nitze was operating in support of Combined Task Force (CTF) 153, established by the Combined Maritime Forces in April to boost multinational collaboration in the Red Sea, Bab al-Mandeb and Gulf of Aden. On 22 November, the vessel seized 2 200 kilograms of hashish and 330 kilograms of methamphetamine as the fishing vessel transited international waters, the US Navy said.

4. **20** foreigners held, being interrogated over claims that al-Shabaab abducted them. **MOGADISHU**, **Somalia**. Police in Somalia on Sunday said that 20 foreigners are being interrogated after they said that they were in the al-Shabaab terror group's captivity for years. Sadik Adan Ali, a police spokesman, said in a statement that the foreigners, including 14 Iranians and six Pakistanis, were apprehended by police in the country's coastal town of Hobyo. He said some of these individuals were said to be abducted by the al-Qaeda-affiliated terrorist group Al-Shabaab in early 2014, while others were kidnapped by the group in the middle of 2019 near the coast of Harardere. "Four of the foreigners have physical injuries," said the police statement. According to local media, the foreigners claimed that they are fishermen and were held captive by al-Shabaab terror groups for years before they arrived in the government-controlled area as they were released by the terrorist group.
